Diagnosis

- 224** Abdominal pain duration impacts the accuracy of ultrasound for diagnosing paediatric appendicitis

Prognosis

- 226** Lack of definitive evidence for the use of renin-angiotensin system antagonists for heart failure with preserved ejection fraction
- 227** Elderly in-hospital cardiac arrest patients who are resuscitated with neurological recovery experience favourable long-term survival similar to non-arrest heart failure patients

Aetiology/Harm

- 229** Cognitive ability in old age may be determined in the womb
