Therapeutics/Prevention

- 14 NSAIDs or paracetamol for short-term treatment of mild to moderate knee pain in early osteoarthritis: are they equivalent?
- 15 Cervical arthroplasty compares favourably to ACDF at half-decade follow-up
- 16 Longer dual antiplatelet therapy (DAPT) after percutaneous coronary intervention has higher anti-ischæmic efficacy than shorter DAPT but is associated with more frequent bleeding
- 17 Low to moderate quality evidence demonstrates the potential benefits and adverse events of cannabinoids for certain medical indications
- 18 Structured diet and physical activity programmes provide strong evidence of effectiveness for type 2 diabetes prevention and improvement of cardiometabolic health
- 19 The addition of abdomen and pelvis CT to limited cancer screening does not increase diagnosis of cancer in patients with unprovoked venous thromboembolism
- 20 Blood glucose monitoring had no impact on distress or self-efficacy in people with non-insulin-treated type 2 diabetes
- 21 Supplemental oxygen in patients without hypoxia in ST segment elevation myocardial infarction increases myocardial injury and infarct size
- 22 Tamsulosin and nifedipine did not improve stone passage over placebo nor were they cost-effective in ureteric stone disease
- 23 No differences between operative and non-operative treatments of proximal humerus fractures
- 24 The effectiveness of a single dose of oral ibuprofen plus caffeine in acute postoperative pain in adults
- 25 Dextromethorphan and quinidine are suitable for off-label short-term treatment of agitation in people with Alzheimer's disease following first-line non-drug approaches

- 26 Initiating antiretroviral therapy in HIV-infected patients with >500 CD4 cells/ μ L provides more benefit than delaying treatment
- 27 Mechanical bowel preps improve surgical outcomes in colorectal surgery
- 28 Early laparoscopic cholecystectomy appears better than delayed laparoscopic cholecystectomy for patients with acute cholecystitis
- 29 Elective colectomy for severe ulcerative colitis may reduce mortality more than medical therapy
- 30 High-dose vitamin D supplementation does not alter bone mass or muscle function over 1 year in postmenopausal women
- 31 Surgery and physical therapy likely yield similar outcomes in spinal stenosis

Prognosis

- 32 Annual volume of very low-birth-weight infant deliveries appears to be more important than level of neonatal intensive care unit for optimising perinatal care
- 33 ACE inhibitors in African Americans with hypertension associated with worse outcomes as compared to other antihypertensives

Aetiology/Harm


- 35 Sugar sweetened beverages are associated with greater incidence of diabetes but there is a paucity of evidence on healthfulness of artificially-sweetened beverages and fruit juices
- 36 A higher overall diet quality is inversely associated with the risk of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) in men and women
- 37 Observational studies are compatible with an association between saturated and trans fats and cardiovascular disease
- 38 The risk of arterial thrombosis increases with the use of combined oral contraceptives


Diagnosis

- 39 Thessaly test is no more accurate than standard clinical tests for meniscal tears
- 40 A single cervical length measurement at 18–24 weeks is a better predictor of preterm birth than the change in cervical length with gestation
